

A gang of kidnappers began chasing a young woman on the streets of Port au She started running and Prince. miraculously escaped her attackers. Fleeing for her life, she ended up at our church in the village of Neply. Pastor Antoine invited her into his home and she began to share her story. Her name is Genise Maitre and she is 23 years old. Her parents died when she little. Having no one to help her she was passed from person to person and by the age of 10 had to sleep on the street. Living in depression, Genise began thinking of ways to kill herself. She had heard about God and told God. I know it will not be a sin if I kill myself because I am going to die soon anyway because I am starving and no one cares. Shortly after that, a woman invited Genise to live with her but the woman was also very poor and life was a daily struggle. Recently the woman left Port au Prince and Genise was again on her own. Pastor Antoine asked Genise what she planned to do. Genise said the only thing she knew to do was to go back to Port au Prince and sell her body on the street to support herself. Pastor Antoine said, No, Genise, you will stay in the village of Neply and go to my church and when my family eats, you will also eat.

Listening to the story of Genise, immediately I could relate to her black

feeling of depression as I too at a young age tried to take my own life. Truly understanding what hopeless feels like, God has been able to use me to bring healing to the broken hearted and minister compassion to the most hopeless place in our Western Hemisphere-Haiti!

The first message God laid upon my heart to share with Genise was to tell her not to be ashamed of the things she's been through and her suffering. 1 Peter 4:16 says, Yet if any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed. So many times the enemy keeps us bound because we are shameful of our sufferings in life and our past failures. Often the very people who Satan works overtime to destroy are the same people who have a call to ministry. Genise is young, with a wonderful future awaiting her but we as the family of God have a mandate to reach out with compassion and help meet her physical needs as God meets her spiritual needs. We will do this as donations come in for this young woman. God wants to give her as it says in Isaiah 61:3, beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, and the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness. He will restore all that the locusts have eaten and what the enemy has stolen from this precious young lady!

We have sent in emergency funds to replace these items. Right now she has moved in with her daughter who is also extremely poor so we are helping with food. Madame Bolo is very frail and elderly and so we ask that you pray she will have peace and that this will not set her back emotionally or physically.
