



HOW WE “ENDED” ON JANUARY 12TH 2010

Santo Church, Ti-Brache Church, Rum Village Church and Security Wall /**All Destroyed**
Marianni Church, Nepley Church/**Damaged**
Santo School/**Destroyed** -Place L'or School/**Severely Damaged**
Trade School and Cafeteria/**Destroyed**
Orphanage/**Severely Damaged**- Homeless Shelter and Nepley Clinic/**Damaged**
Security Wall around Nursing Home Property/**Partially Destroyed/Damaged**
All Wells **Destroyed** except for In Rum Village
Three Mission Vehicles **Damaged** and 2 **Destroyed** New Commercial Generator /**Destroyed**

HOW WE “STARTED AGAIN” AND WHERE WE ARE NOW

- Immediately began erecting Temporary Shelters for 4000 (Plus) People following Quake
- Assisted families through monthly Food Programs all year
- Provided Medical Assistance for the Injured and kept our regular Clinic Programs in operation
- Built four Temporary Churches in Marianni, Nepley, Ti-Brache, Rum Village
(The undamaged portion of the old Nepley Church is being used as a Food and Supply Warehouse)
- Built and Opened a New School in Ti-Brache which includes Kindergarten through High School plus evening
- Trade Classes/added a morning Feeding Program for children
- Found Christian Placement Homes for Orphaned Children
- Repaired Homeless Shelter and its now back in use
- Currently Building New Clinic (Old smaller clinic has been repaired and is being used as part of the Homeless Shelter)
- Rebuilt Security Wall around Property in Rum Village and a New Permanent Community Church Building is now under construction
- Drilled new well in Ti-Brache area and purchased a Commercial Generator for the Church/School
- Bought land in Nepley and completed building the security wall around it
(This land is where we have erected the Temporary Church, and where the New Clinic is now under construction)
- Drilled an Artesian Well in Nepley and piped water to homes, the Homeless Shelter and Nursing Home Properties
- Provided employment to Haitians through our building projects and hired Haitian women to cook a nutritious meal for all of our workers on job sites each day.
- Held Evangelism Training Classes and sent graduates out to Evangelize Unreached Villages
- Currently waiting on a shipment of shelters to clear Haitian Customs/these will be set up on our Nursing Home Property once cleared

**Many people came to Christ again this year, including three Voodoo Priests!
