On February 16th-- 14 people from Georgetown area flew out of Toronto, Canada with our organization to Port au Prince, Haiti. The team came to Haiti for one week to help spread the Gospel message of hope and give Humanitarian Aid to many poverty stricken individuals and families. On the team we were so privileged to have 2 Canadian Veterinarians who dedicated much of their time to vaccinating and de-worming goats in our villages as well as other animals.



Our organization works in approximately 10 villages, but the main focus for this team was to provide help in one of our poorest areas known as the Rum Village. In 2008 we purchased land and drilled a well to give the community clean water. Around the property where we intend to build a new church facility, construction of the security wall has been started.



In our Neply Church on Sunday March 8, special ordination services were held to ordain 5 new Ministers. We continue to see men and women in Haiti being raised up to be sent out and preach the Gospel across the island and to hold crusades in the mountains and in unreached areas.



Construction of the Trade School Project in the Santo area is progressing well. With God's help we hope to have the construction finished by this summer. The next phase of the project will be to outfit the facility with desks, chairs and needed equipment and supplies for training and teaching the students.



With the amount of people now on our clinic programs, we needed to do a few renovations. Now instead of people entering into the Neply courtyard to go to the clinic, we have an entrance from the road and our waiting area has been expanded with more seating for people who attend our clinic programs.



We have also been doing repairs to several homes in the villages and have been working on building a home for a Haitian family. The father's name is Raymond. He and his family have struggled for years and were living in extreme poverty. Raymond is a talented wood carver but lacked tools and a place to do his work. We have helped supply him with the tools he needed and now he will have 2 rooms for his family to live in and one room to do his wood carving business. With the right tools, he has already been a blessing to our mission work and has helped make furniture we have needed for several mission projects. Now he is equipped to be able to properly care for his family and have employment.



We continue to reach out to people through our food programs. Each Sunday morning people receive a snack before morning service so they can focus on the worship and message rather than on having an empty stomach. We also do as many village feedings as we can with the finances we have on hand. People continue to come to Christ as we show them God's love and the great compassion He has for them. During the months of January and February, over 30,000 pounds of food was distributed through all of our ministry programs and to our villages.





One woman recently accepted Christ and gave her testimony in our Nepley Church in January. Her name is Jacline Jean Jacques. She was a voodoo priestess for 15 years and was heavily into sacrificing animals and humans to the voodoo Gods. Also if a Haitian person was angry with someone and wanted them cursed and killed, they would pay her money and she would hire her workers to go and kill them. Now though, Jacline is saved and serving God but she needs prayer because leaving her position as a voodoo priestess meant giving up a good income. Our Nepley Church is reaching out to her through our food programs to help her with the needs she has until God opens another door for her!
