Many bean crops have been planted in a few of our areas to try to produce food and also sell to give many people an income who currently are without jobs. The only challenge is, we still need more rain for the crops to grow well.

➤ **Pray for a couple named Louis and Enante Cinteluce.**

This is a Christian couple and their family who literally had been with no food for 2 weeks and were starving to death. We have given them financial help but will need to find a way for them to have regular help.

➤ **Pray for our elderly people in Haiti.**

Its difficult to see the poverty in Haiti, but when we find the elderly living in a shack, with no water, toilet, electricity, no income, food, torn and tattered clothing and they are crippled up in pain, sleeping on a dirt floor, its really heart breaking. Our clinic provides help for so many elderly people but the need is far greater than anyone could imagine and we are hoping to be able to add to our current programs in the future.

➤ **Keep praying that Haiti will see Revival and be "Transformed."**

Our churches in Haiti are continuing to have more powerful services than they've ever experienced in years past. Again last Sunday, in Neply a woman came to church and she was delivered of evil spirits. There had also been some tension in a few relationships among leaders but God intervned and all problems were dissolved. There was forgiveness on all parts and people were rejoicing and dancing as their hearts were freed.





When our family was living in Haiti, our daughter Jenna-Lynn who was five years old always enjoyed holding the little Haitian babies during church. There was one little baby in particular that Jenna fell in love with who's name was Gina.

Baby Gina was beautiful with bright eyes and clear, dark skin. She lived with her mother in a one room cement house. Each Sunday as we entered the church, Gina's mom would get up out of her seat and bring baby Gina and place her in Jenna's little arms.

On most Sundays at the end of each service, Jenna would leave with a very soaked dress as little Gina never had a diaper on. As often as we could, our family would give Gina's mom financial help and gifts of clothing or food.


When we moved back to Canada from Haiti, Jenna continued to remember Gina and often gave up her allowance to help Gina and her mom.

Today, Gina is one of our top students and attends our school in Santo. During one of my recent trips to Haiti, I called Gina out of the classroom to give her a graduation photo of Jenna and also a gift. Gina took the photo and got a sad look on her face. She then pulled up her little skirt and holding Jenna's picture told me to take a photo of her skin and send it to Jenna. It was then that Gina told me, she was helping her mom cook some food one day and the pot of boiling oil fell on her and burned her skin. The scars from the hot oil continue on down Gina's leg.

We prayed for Gina and are asking for your prayers also. Surgery is expensive for Haitian people but fortunately Gina has already undergone two surgeries to try to correct her scars and relieve the pain but she will need many more unless God does a miracle.

The scarring is so thick that you can see the lump through Gina's clothing and it is very irritating for her.

Please keep Gina and her Mom in your prayers! Regularly in Haiti, we have emergencies arise where people need immediate help. We're not always prepared for the unexpected but God has been good in meeting so many of the needs.
