At the age of 10, her parents were heavily into voodoo and she remembers them telling her that one day after a voodoo ceremony she was outside and fell down and died. Her body was then placed in an above ground cement grave. Three days later a Christian lady came to the parents and said that she had a dream that there was a girl sleeping in a grave and in the dream God told her to come and open the grave and take the girl out. When the lady went and opened the grave, Madame Theser came alive but was a zombie. She spent years eating dirt off the ground and doing crazy things as zombie's do. One night at Neply Church a crusade was held and someone brought her to the services. God healed her mind and she accepted Christ that evening! Today Madame Theser is married and is one of our worship leaders in the church! With God, ALL things are Possible!

People Praying for Haiti at the Crusade

Preparing to Bag 13,000 pounds of Rice for Distribution

n April, our mission hosted a wonderful Pastors and leaders conference. On the last day we took them and their wives to a Hotel in Port au Prince for a special marriage seminar! The majority of these Pastors and wives had never set foot inside a hotel or restaurant in their entire lives so they felt like Kings and Queens to be treated to this special day! They have all given out so much since the earthquake that we felt we needed to encourage, strengthen and bless them for all they have done for people! The following week we held a crusade in the Neply church and we expected about 2000 people to show up but much to our surprise over 6000 people attended! The temporary church in Neply that we built after the earthquake is over a year old now and is not strong enough to last through rain and hurricane seasons so we are praying for a "Financial Miracle" to be able to put up a permanent and large enough building to suit the need! All of our building projects accomplish much more than just getting a building erected. Our buildings are community projects and many Haitian people are given needed jobs so they can rebuild their own lives and also have a sense of purpose and self-worth! It also gives many people experience and training under the leadership of the main bosses on the job. For every project done, we hire Haitian women to cook a hot, nutritious meal for all those from the community who help. Since the earthquakes as well. Its wonderful to see how many people have come to Christ in the past year but we are having problems with enough space for people not only in church but who are needing to be on our programs which increases our monthly costs!

We have many families in our villages connected and being trained for micro-loans through a foundation we are working with, so hopefully in years to come we will see a lot of them become self-supportive! The program is going well but in such a broken country it will take several years to see the results we are looking for. In the meantime, they still need our help to survive!

Thanks to our Faithful supporters like you, this month again we were able to distribute 13,000 pounds of rice to people in need who live in extreme poverty!
